

“A Pastoral Landscape Dedicated to Remembering”

A new civic space is emerging in the Town of Belmont. Covering nearly fourteen acres (phase one consisting of 4 acres is currently under development) of high ground on Concord Avenue, Highland Meadow Cemetery is not only a new cemetery, it is a new kind of cemetery. This is a place of memorial that begins by remembering the land itself.

Once one of the nation’s most significant pastures—W. W. Chenery’s Holstein cattle grazed there before anywhere else in the United States—this land is being recreated as a grassy meadow, surrounded by a revived orchard, woodlot and evergreen allée. The property is interlaced with fieldstone walls, stone paddock fences and barn relics, overlooking protected conservation land.

With space for conventional casket burials and respectful sites for committing cremated remains, this beautiful new municipal cemetery will enable Belmont residents to choose their hometown as a final place of rest for the first time in nearly two decades.

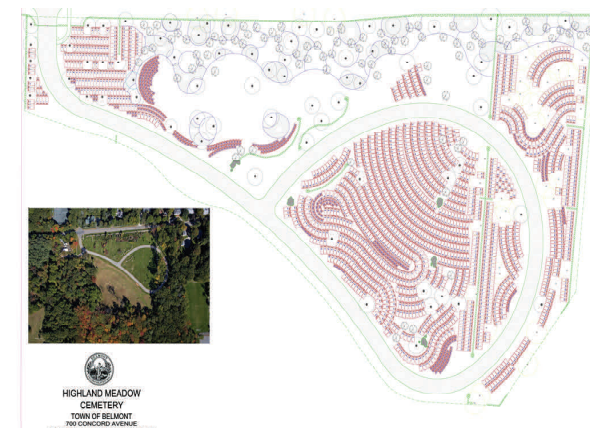
