Public Forums and Input Sessions (live, or may have remote participation option):

- Monday, October 11, 2021 Indigenous Peoples' Day Celebration, Time TBD: The Town is
 preparing to hold an in-person celebration for Indigenous Peoples' Day, to commemorate
 the Town's first celebration of this important day.
- Monday, October 25, 2021 at 5pm Town Administrator Office Hours: The Town
 Administrator is announcing Office Hours to hear concerns and answer questions from
 residents. A ZOOM link will be posted on the Town's Website for community members to
 attend.
- Middle and High School Tours to the public: The School is having public tours of the new High School on Saturday, October 23rd. Time TBD. Check the school's webpage for more details as they come.

Select Board Initiatives

- <u>Fuel Tank Forum II:</u> The second Fuel Storage Replacement Forum was held on Tuesday, September 28th. The Select Board voted to conduct a three month pilot to have departments with unleaded vehicles fuel up at off-site locations in Belmont. This pilot will serve to collect more data and real time experiences to inform the community of its fueling capabilities.
- FY22 Quarter 1 Report: The Select Board will be hearing the Quarter 1 Report at its October 18th meeting. The Town is seeing challenges in its Police and Fire staffing. The Police Chief and the Fire Chief gave department updates at the Select Boards October 4th meeting. Belmont Fire Department Receives New Rescue Tools

The Belmont Fire Department has received and has placed in service two new battery powered rescue tools. The Hurst "edraulic" spreader and cutting tools are manufactured by the well-known maker of the original "Jaws of Life". These tools, unlike their predecessors which were powered by a gasoline engine and tethered by hydraulic cords, are completely portable, quiet, and more powerful than earlier models. "These extrication tools represent the best technology and feature the portability we need to operate anyplace on or off the roadway. In the hands of a skilled firefighter the tools give us excellent capability to extricate people from all nature of entrapments," stated Chief David DeStefano.
